The program will be supported by social occasions each semester. You are also free to add other subjects outside the designated timeslot and to complete the award more quickly.

FEES

Apply for an Anniversary Scholarship from Pilgrim to cover 75% of the University of Divinity fees in 2017: www.pilgrim.edu.au/anniversary_scholarship

Fees for successful applicants will be: \$572.

Applications close July 14, 2017.

You can also cover either the full fee (or the \$572 remaining if you have an Anniversary Scholarship) with FEE-HELP. FEE-HELP is an Australian Government loan scheme that assists eligible students enrolled in fee-paying places, to pay all or part of their tuition fees. There is no age limit on these loans.
